

Terms of Use for Electric Vehicle Charging Points

TRANSLATION ONLY - THE GERMAN TEXT SHALL PREVAIL

Welcome to Innsbruck Airport. To make your stay as pleasant as possible, please review the most important regulations governing the use of electric vehicle charging points owned by Tiroler Flughafenbetriebsges.m.b.H. (TFG for short) as provided below. These regulations are supplementary to the Facility Regulations.

General regulations

- There are currently 6 electric vehicle charging points (Type 2, 22 kW AC) on Deck A of the multi-storey car park. These Terms of Use for Electric Vehicle Charging Points apply in addition to the General Terms of Use for Car Parks, a current version of which can be found on the TFG website. In the case of any violation of the Terms of Use, the TFG reserves the right to seek injunctive relief against the user.
- Instructions provided by TFG staff and its agents are to be followed at all times.

Safety measures

- The facility conforms to all electrical safety regulations that were in force at the time of construction (2015).
- Electric/hybrid vehicles may only be connected if free of any defects.
- The charging cable must be properly secured to avoid creating a hazard (e.g. trip or water) or damage (e.g. driven over).
- Any faults at the charging point are to be reported to the TFG immediately.

Charges and availability

- There are currently no additional charges for electricity consumed through use of the electric vehicle charging points. The TFG, therefore, reserves the right to interrupt the availability of electricity at any time.
- The electric vehicle charging points are provided for occasional use. Ongoing usage, e.g. by residents or commercial users, is not permitted. The TFG reserves the right to exclude individuals or vehicles from using this service.

Limitations for duration of usage

- Parking spaces with electric vehicle charging points may only be used for a maximum of 48 hours, while the vehicle is charging. The TFG can have a vehicle removed at the cost and risk of the user and/or file an action of trespass or an injunction suit if a vehicle is parked for longer than the intended maximum parking duration without permission.

Disclaimer

- Use of the electric vehicle charging point is at the user's own risk.
- As usage is free of charge, the TFG expressly excludes any and all liability. The TFG also explicitly accepts no liability for damages resulting from the use of the charging point (lightning strikes, voltage surges, theft due to premature release of the charging cable, etc.).

Conduct in the event of fire

In the event of a fire or burning smell, the fire alarm should be activated (**push-button alarm**) or the **fire service (122)** contacted with the following information: the location and cause of the fire (car, building), the number of people injured and the caller's name.

If necessary and possible, anyone at risk should be warned and vulnerable or injured people should be evacuated.

While taking personal safety into account (beware of electric shocks), an attempt should be made to extinguish the fire using a suitable fire extinguisher. Otherwise, the site should be evacuated as quickly as possible on foot.

Lifts must not be used in the event of fire. Further information can be found in the TFG fire safety regulations (see page 3).
